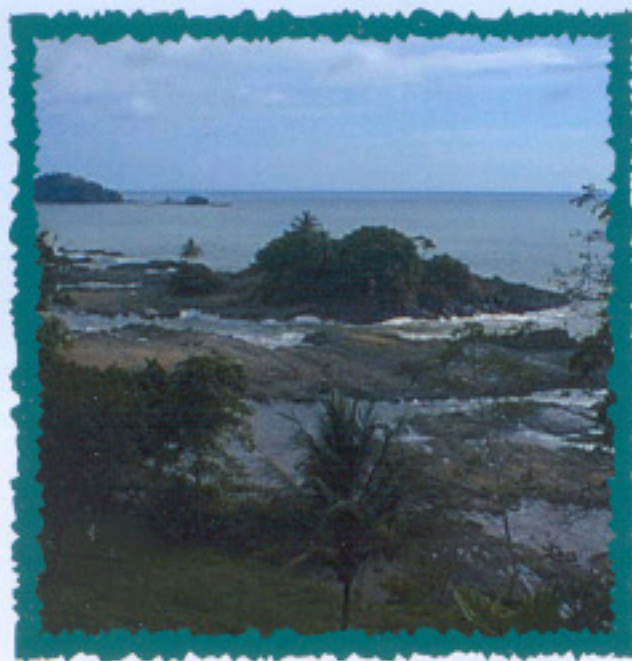


TRANSPORTATION

By Land: There are two available routes to the South. One route is from San José to San Isidro via the Inter-American Highway. The Inter-American is in pretty good shape and paved the entire way. If you choose this route you will have the opportunity to pass through Cerro de la Muerte, the highest point in all of Central America along the Inter-American Highway. The other route is the San José-Quepos-Dominical route, following the South Coastal Highway, which offers beautiful country landscapes as well as breath-taking views of the Pacific Coast, however many parts of this highway are not paved. Within the Southern region there is also a sufficient network of roads both paved and non but we would recommend the use of 4-wheel drive to visit some of the off-the-beaten path type-sites.



GEOGRAPHICS CHARACTERISTICS

The Southern Region has a varying topography of mountains valleys, plateaus and plains. The altitude of this region varies from 0 meters (feet) above sea level to 3, 820 meters (11,460 feet) above sea level at Mount Chirripó, the highest point in Costa Rica and located in Chirripó National Park.

By Air: There are many small airports in the Southern Region, both public and private. You can charter private flights in Palmar Sur, Golfito, Puerto Jiménez y Coto 47. Some national airlines fly regularly to these destinations as well.

By boat: Water transportation is available between different points within the Southern Region especially between Sierpe-Drake Bay and Golfito-Puerto Jiménez on a daily basis. For other destinations you will have to charter boats.

Docks and Marinas: There are two docks: one in Golfito for loading and unloading cargo including imports and another in Puerto Jiménez for smaller loads. There are other smaller docks along the coast, both public and private.



CLIMATE

The climate varies with the altitude, for the most part it is a dry-humid-tropical zone and very rainy. The average temperature is about 27.3° C (86.6° F) with a fluctuation of 19.4° C (70.8° F) in the highest points to 27.6° C (87.2° F) in the lowest points. The average annual precipitation is 3,808.7 mm (150 inches). The rainy season occurs in the months of May through November, October being the rainiest, and the dry season is from December through April.

ELECTRICITY

There is electrical service throughout all the communities in the Southern Region with coverage of more than 90%. (The smaller and more remote villages are included in this statistic and have less access to electricity) The voltage used is 110/220.



TELECOMMUNICATION AND MAIL

Telecommunication is very developed with a wide availability of public telephone coverage even in the most remote areas. Cellular communication is available in certain parts of the region as well. Postal services are offered in all of the principle cities. These offices offer Internet access, however Internet is also accessible in Tourist Information Centers and Chambers of Commerce as well as in Internet Cafés.
